Developing of Learning Materials

1. INTRODUCTION

Although learning material should be developed to serve quality and intellectual credibility, in coherence with institutional mision and goals, it must reflect a balance between academic freedom and institutional autohority.

Development of learning material is a continious process acknowledging the fact that there are continoious development in science, society and context.

Learning material should support learning outcomes and programme purposes.

2. LEARINING MATERIAL DEVELOPMENT

- a. Learning material must continuously be developed and include new research and/or publications in each field of learning or specific subjects.
- b. In par with our mission and objectives of the institution any void claims and needs that occur in practice lead to development of learning materials.
- c. Each lecturer is responsible for the development of his/her learning material.
- d. Learning material should be submitted to the quality committee.
- e. Comments from external examiners and moderators with regard to learning material should be considered, studied, discussed and incorporated into learning material if necessary and applicable.

3. SUPERVISION OF MATERIAL AND DEVELOPMENT

Supporting the implementation of the policy, a standard form is developed that should be completed by external examinators commenting on learning material, development and quality. A quality audit must be conducted every five years or on a frequency the Senate and Board decides upon and provision must be made in the budget.
